The C24/7 After-school Program provides opportunities for elementary, middle, and high school students to receive educational, physical, spiritual and emotional support. Our mission is to help them learn, grow, and thrive in and out of the classroom. We build relationships with students and their families, serve their immediate needs, then walk with them on their way to becoming empowered individuals.

C24/7's Job Development Program, called Dreams, Visions, Work, provides spiritual support and job training in order to connect men and women to work that taps into their unique skills and purpose. We do this through building relationships with local businesses, teaching a proven curriculum, and walking each step of the way with our students.



Since COVID started, we have exponentially expanded our reach in the community. Though currently on pause, we've provided a free, monthly store for our community members. Neighbors receive household goods and food for their families, and through the store we have built stronger relationships with those in our community. Once per month we served up to 300 people. We've also partnered with the United Way and Cook County Legal Aid for Housing and Debt to offer free vaccines and housing support.

Our students lack opportunity in the Summer and their education suffers. Often young people turn to dangerous and illegal ways to make money, while our program steps in to redirect them out of gang recruitment and into effective employment and job training. We offer students a chance to work throughout the summer, earning a generous stipend while gaining valuable work experience. While working, students attend and complete our job training program which teaches the value of honest work and personal finance.



Because we live and spend so much time in the community, we are always aware of the needs of our neighbors. Strong relationships lead to strong change. We provide weekly men's and women's Bible studies, one-on-one counseling sessions, Fresh Start Funding for those navigating major life transitions and street ministry to help our neighbors in the midst of gang activity, violence, drug use, and more. We've also held a monthly food pantry serving thousands of people per year.

The Great Giveaway was started a few years ago. It was in honor of my brother, Nate (The Great) that passed away, and also a way to give back to the neighborhood with a day full of fun, laughter, and love. We always talk about doing something great for the neighborhood helping the kids and the families. This year was our 3rd year. The past three years have been great as so many people have come out from the neighborhood, even people that used to live in the neighborhood. Folks have traveled hours just to be a part of it. Almost 500 people came out with their kids last summer. It was a great feeling to know I was able to bring the community together. You can see all the smiles, the love, and joy. The excitement on the kids' faces, not only for the toys, but all the fun activities. Every year The Great Giveaway has been growing bigger. I will continue to bless the people and bring happiness with the event.

## PEOPLE SERVED

Our After-School program hosts 60 students coming predominantly from below the poverty level, who join our program starting an average of two grade levels below proficiency in reading and 1.5 grade levels below proficiency in math.

However,100% of our kids move to the next grade level at the end of each year, and the majority have increased their reading and math scores on standardized tests. We are at full capacity, and have to hold a waitlist. Our Summer Program hosts about 30 students each year.

Roughly half of our community outreach connects with men and women with little or no education background, predominantly from our high-risk, low-income neighborhood. The amount of relationships we've built in the community keeps growing, reaching into the thousands. Our Job Development Program continues to grow through hiring members of the community for project-based jobs and internships while they go through our curriculum. Our Summer Youth Work Program hires several high school students for internships while they complete our job training program.

Through expanding our programming to meet our neighbors' need, we aim to realize our long-term goals:

- · Lowered rates of crime and violent activity
- Improved health of our constituents
- Higher rates of economic empowerment for all of our constituents
- Increased household spending power and civic engagement
- Restored community through lowered rates of prison and gang re-entry
- · Improved academic success for our children
- · A more empowered community

How Has C24/7 Impacted you? Growing up, life for Malachi didn't seem to have much settling. Moving from state to state due to financial reasons took a toll on him and his mother. When they finally settled into Chicago in 2018, he still felt an unrest. "There is a lot of peer pressure and violence here. The environment is not the best and it impacted me and my mom. Me and my mom's relationship feels empty, but there isn't too much I can do about it now since I am just a kid." Though there are moments of hopelessness for many in our community, this has not stopped Malachi from being a top achiever at school, landing on the honor roll, playing on the basketball team, and working for C24/7 two days a week. He says, "the bad environment in this community has motivated me to do better. It's making me want to do good for my future and get a scholarship for a good college. I want to major in math or something with numbers because I want to be an accountant." Malachi has been a part of C24/7 for almost 3 years. He is currently enrolled in our high school After-school Program and also completed our Summer Youth Work Program as well. "Our discussions help me release my thoughts and emotions. C24 is caring for their students and their futures. It feels good to be at Program and like I am at home. If you were to go there today you would feel twice as good walking out.


#### history

Founded in 2016, C24/7: Father's Arms Ministries was created by Natalie and James Crockett. James grew up on the South Side of Chicago, and from an early age missed having a central father figure in his life. He spent his formative years in and out of gang activity and prison, only to end up accepting the overwhelming power of God's father-like love at the age of 19. Ever since, he has been passionate about living out the love of God and acting as a father figure to aneighborhood desperately in need of one. Our organization was born out of this passion. Through the hard work of our staff and volunteers, we were awarded 501(c)(3) status as of April 14, 2017.

Since our inception, we have reached, served, and empowered our shared community through an After-school Program, Job Development Training, and Community Outreach. We have started new programs, grown our programs, and extended our reach to thousands of people in the past decade. We have sought to meet our community in their need, walking with them through the terrible, but real trials of violence, poverty, and lack of opportunity.

C24/7 is a non-profit organization dedicated, through the power of Jesus Christ, to improving the lives of children and young adults in the North of Howard neighborhood by providing the necessary tools, security, and environment they need to thrive academically, economically, socially, and spiritually.



#### Dear C24/7 Family,

Writing this annual letter is always a good time for me to pause and reflect. This past year really was a pivotal year in so many ways for C24/7. We have labeled it the year of "growing pains." We grew our programs, grew our space, added new programs, reached more community members, and hired more staff. But the pain came in the mental and emotional weight...the emotional weight of losing so many loved ones, from the neighborhood and my own family. The weight of leading a ministry that God has entrusted me with. It is a great honor and privilege, one I take very seriously, which is why I take responsibility for those in my care.

Despite the heaviness this past year handed to us, the growth has been very exciting. In fact, our stories of hope and transformation get me through the hard times. For example, we were able to support a single mother of 4 who just obtained a job for the first time in many years, all while her husband is in prison. We saw one of our high school students, who was recently moved from his home due to abuse, hired into our summer job program and enrolled into our high school program, AND is maintaining a 4.0 GPA! We saw one of our young men that graduated from our job program last year finally land a full-time job. These stories continue to give us hope. Hope that is desperately needed during some of the more trying days and weeks and months.


There is another side to the stories of hope and excitement. The pain part is a real part of our Urban Ministry. We lost several of our community members, men and children that I dearly loved and cared for, due to mental health and gun violence. It's in these times I question God and why He has me here. What's the point? It feels hopeless that some of these same men are turning their lives around and ready for something new, only to be killed. But then God reminded me of the thief on the cross. It was in his last moments on earth that he committed his life to Jesus. And that's when I felt a sense that all of this is worth it. Our neighbors' salvation is worth every minute of my time with them. It is not

As I continue to grieve these losses I am encouraged because I also see the fruit of our labor. I see lives changed, hope given, and mothers, fathers, and children seeking options for a better life.


